(Under the Maharashtra Act No. XXXVIII of 2023)

2	Definitions	2.1	In this ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires:
			(i) "Academic Council", "Board of Management", "Governing Body" and "Board of Examinations", means "Academic Council", "Board of Management", "Governing Body" and "Board of Examinations", of the University as specified in the Act or Statutes made under;
			(ii) "Act" means the "MIT Vishwaprayag University, Solapur Act -2023 (Mah. Act No. XXXVIII of 2023";
			(iii) "Authorities" means the authorities of the university as specified by or under the Act;
			(iv)"campus" means the area of the university within which it is established;(v) "class" means specific group of students meeting for
			specific instructional courses;
			(vi) "continuing Student" means a student, who has completed at least one term, prior to the current term.
			(vii) "course" means a prescribed set of instructions in a subject offered as a unit of studies within an academic program;
			(viii) "Dean" means a faculty member heading a School
			(ix) "faculty" means one or more group of academic studies concerned with a major division of knowledge
			(x) "faculty member" means a person appointed by the University, who teaches a course, imparts education or guides research or renders guidance in any form to the students for academic credit of the University or otherwise;
			(xi) "fee" means monetary collection made by the university or its colleges, institutions or study centers, as the case may be, from the students by whatever name it may be called, which is not refundable;
			(xii) "Government" or "State Government" means the Government of Maharashtra;

- (xiii) The terms "he", "his", "him" in relation to any officer or person referred to in these Statutes also mean and include "she", "her", "her" respectively;
- (xiv) "Higher education" means pursuit of knowledge beyond learning at the stage of higher secondary school education;
- (xv) "hostel" means a place of residence for the students of the university, or its institutions and study centers, established or recognized to be as such by the university;
- "Online and Distance Education" means (xvi) including of education imparted conduct examinations by a combination of any one or more viz. means of communication, broadcasting, telecasting, correspondence courses, seminars, webinars, contact programs and any other such methodology including online courses, instructions etc.;
 - (xvii) "prescribed" means prescribed by Statutes or Ordinances or Regulations, as the case may be, made by or under this Act;
 - (xviii) "Regulating body" means a body established by the Central Government for laying down norms and conditions for ensuring academic standards of higher education, such as the University Grants Commission, All India Council of Technical Education, National Council of Teacher Education, National Medical Commission, Pharmacy Council of India, National Council of Assessment and Accreditation, Indian Council of Agriculture Research, Distance Education Council, Council of Scientific and Indian Research, etc., and includes the Government;
- (xix) "Professor", "Associate Professor" or "Assistant Professor" means a faculty member so designated as per the guidelines of University Grants Commission and/or other regulatory bodies;
- (xx) "Programme" means a set of courses leading to a certificate, diploma and degree;
- (xxi) "Registrar", "Registrar (Assessment & Evaluation" and "Vice-Chancellor" means

			(xxii) "School" means combination of various programmes of studies run in the University specialized in one particular area or faculty or subjects; (xxiii) "section" means a section of the Act;
			(xxiv) "Sponsoring body" means the Maharashtra Academy of Engineering and Educational Research, Pune, a Public Trust registered under the Maharashtra Public Trusts Act having its registered office at S. No. 124, Ex-Servicemen Colony Post office, Paud Road, Kothrud, Pune 411 038;
			(xxv) "State" means the State of Maharashtra; (xxvi) "Statutes", "Ordinances" or "Regulations" mean respectively, the Statutes, Ordinances or
			Regulations of the university made under this Act; (xxvii) "student" means a person enrolled in the university for taking a course of study for a degree, diploma or other academic distinction instituted by the university, including a research degree;
			(xxviii) "Study center" means a center established and maintained or recognized by the university for the purpose of advising, counselling or for rendering any other assistance required by the students in the context of online and distance education;
			(xxix) "term" means Academic year or a part of academic year and includes Semester/Trimester/Other duration, wherever applicable;
			(xxx) "UGC" means University Grants Commission;
			(xxxi) "University" means the MIT Vishwaprayag University, Solapur.(xxxii) Words and expressions not defined in these
			Ordinances shall have the same meaning assigned to
			them in the Act.
3	Admission and Enrollment of Students	3.1	The admission criteria for various programmes run by the University shall be published in the admission prospectus as per the corresponding regulations formed by the University according to the provisions of the Act. Admission criteria along with the schedule shall be published by the University at least two months before the commencement of the academic session.
		3.2	Admission of students and Enrolment of the provisionally admitted and continuing students shall be done as per the

			schedule notified by the University each year by an Admission Committee formed by the Vice Chancellor.
4	Programmes of	4.1	(i) The University shall offer Certificate, Diploma, Under
	Studies for award of degrees and certificates		Graduate, Post Graduate and Doctoral programmes in the
			subjects under respective faculties/Schools or a
			combination thereof as provided in the Act;
			(ii) The nomenclature of various degrees shall be as
			approved by academic council and as per the guidelines of
			University Grants Commission and/or concerned
			regulatory bodies;
			(iii) The structure and duration of the Academic programs
			shall be as approved by the Governing Body on the
			recommendation of Academic Council;
			(iv) Criteria for different levels of entry and exit of
			students for various programmes shall be as per the
			regulations of concerned programmes formed by the
			University;
			(v) The University may also run programmes/courses of
			study through online and distance learning,
			correspondence or any other technological mode with
			appropriate approvals of the academic council and as per
			the guidelines of University Grants Commission
			prescribed from time to time; and
			(vi) The University may also offer full time/part time
			Diploma and Certificate programs of shorter durations in
			various faculties /disciplines/interdisciplinary, vocational
			and skill development courses/programmes as approved
			by the Academic Council.

			(Assessment & Evaluation) and/or Registrar of the
			University;
			(iv)The Passing Certificate, wherever necessary, shall be
			issued to the candidates and the same shall be signed /
			digitally signed by the Registrar (Assessment &
			Evaluation) and/or Registrar of the University;
			(v) The Degree Certificates shall be signed by the President /
			Vice Chancellor and/or Registrar of the University;
			(vi)The University shall make provisions for establishing
			Academic service mechanism enabling students' mobility
			by registering to Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) as per
			the UGC regulations; and
			(vii) The University shall establish a system for uploading data on the Digi Locker NAD platform or any such other systems mandated by the central regulatory bodies.

			resolution passed by simple majority of the total number of
			members of the Governing Body and by a majority not less
			than two thirds of the members present and voting at the
			meeting, if such a person has been found to have obtained a
			degree or diploma or certificate fraudulently, or has obtained
			admission through a false caste certificate or any such claim:
			Provided that, no action under this section shall be taken
			against any person unless he has been given an opportunity
			to show cause against the action proposed to be taken.
			Provided further that, a copy of resolution passed by the
			Governing Body shall be immediately sent to the person
			concerned, along with the show-cause notice.
